### Hi All

What a thrilling start we have had to this year's Outings. I was not able to make Fennes (Hills & Black Lake) in March for the season's opener but what a great start! Harry Shearman winning by just loz after weighing in a Carp of 16lbs 4ozs. A good match winning fish giving him a total weight of 22lbs 12ozs. Keith Wicker also landed a double figure Carp during the match and finished with 22lbs 11ozs in 2nd place. 3rd place was Micky Eid with 20lbs exactly. Hills & Black always throw's up specimen fish and other notable catches were double figure carp from

Terry Withington and Ray Flesher, a 3lbs 8ozs Tench from Craig Ramsey and a 2lbs 2ozs Perch from Tony Westgarth. Cracking Fish!!

The second match saw us at Pea Lane Fishery in Upminster. Fishing conditions were not great for this pit style lake. Tommy Eldridge started bagging early in shallower covered Peg 1 and it looked like Tommy would win from the favoured peg, but fish, especially Carp as they are at this time of year, can be a bit 'iffy' and easily back off feed. However it was 2 hours into the match when it really kicked-off and it was the start of a neck and neck contest between Paul Jenkins, myself and Barry Blyth. On Pegs 15,17 and 18 (with 16 unoccupied). Paul started the proceedings with a 'lump' on the bomb and pellet. Barry and I caught fish on Pellet Waggler for the rest of the match, taking fish between 4lbs and 8lbs at depths between 3 and 4ft. Paul had a great mixed bag of Skimmers and a few big Carp to 13lbs 6 ozs for a final weight of 53lbs 4ozs in 3rd place. Barry took 2nd with 54lbs 8ozs and I

### A Fisherman's Tale

If you know me you will realise I am very keen on promoting fishing on our 2 mile stretch of the River Roding. During January, February & March this year I fished on a dozen occasions mainly in the afternoon until it got dark. Tackling up in the Car Park and taking minimal tackle, light rod, reel with 3lbs line tied to a 16 hook and 2lbs hook length strength, I tried all swims down to the weir. Every time I caught roach up to 1/2 lb but not always in the same swims. I also caught two small dace, about six minnows, three perch up to 1/2 lb and two chub - the photo of one is left. On that day I took the club scales and it weighed 3lbs 10ozs. This is the best chub I think I have ever had on our stretch of river.

The Club is planning to remove - with the farmer - some more of the willow trees that have fallen in over the years - if you wander down later in the year you will see the obvious swims. Why not give it a try - I would love to hear your reports no matter what. **Mike Jenkins.**

### PIT & RIVER MATCH REPORT

I am writing this report with two matches March & April of the new season completed. The March match was held at Langford Bridge fishery where 17 members fished for a total weight of 71lbs 11ozs. The match

was dominated by Bream with the best one caught by Martin Reader of 6lbs 5ozs. Except for a Carp just before the whistle of 16lbs 8ozs by Jerry Kemp. A few nice roach were caught the biggest at 10ozs caught by Tommy Eldridge.

The April match was at Old Moreton where only 10 fished for a total weight of 84lbs. Tommy Eldridge had a lovely bag of silver fish at 23lbs 11ozs - mainly Roach & Rudd plus a bonus 2lbs Bream. Terry Withington was 2nd with two Carp and bits and I was third with a good bag of 17lbs 6ozs all Roach & Rudd including a Roach of 1lbs 3ozs. This match was 1 week after the dye, to kill the weed growth chemical was put in and as you can see it has not affected the fishing.

I look forward to seeing old & new Members at our not to serious home matches. ### ONGAR NO I | TOMMY ELDRIDGE

The lake is looking a lot more open as Danny the Farmer (lake owner) has decided to clear all big willows and brambles from the lake side. So it will look different!! Planting is already in progress—shrubs and bushes. Some nice Chub and Roach being caught on the river. 20 Tench ranging from 4 to 6lbs have recently been stocked.

### OLD MORETON | BARRY ETHERINGTON

Hi All - The lake at Old Moreton is still low and the ground is still firm. The fishing is good with nice bags of roach & bream and still one or two Carp now appearing. The Bomb Hole is still fishing well though - with very large Pike, Carp and Bream. Also expect some big Roach Rudd & Perch.

Be careful when getting to and from The Bomb Hole swims, the Club recommend two members go together for safety.
